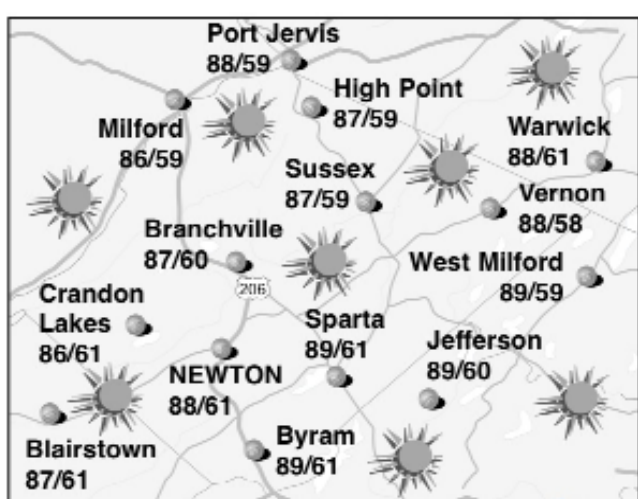

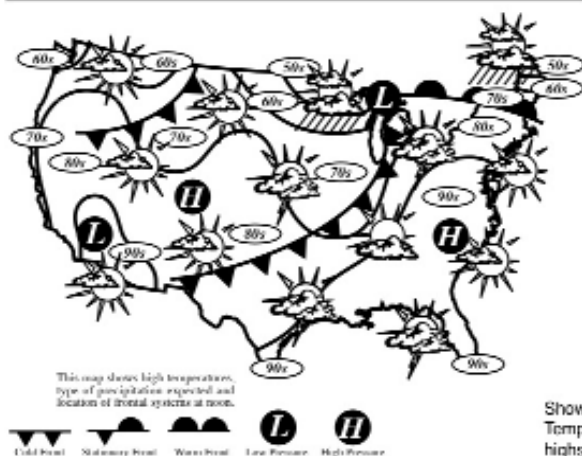

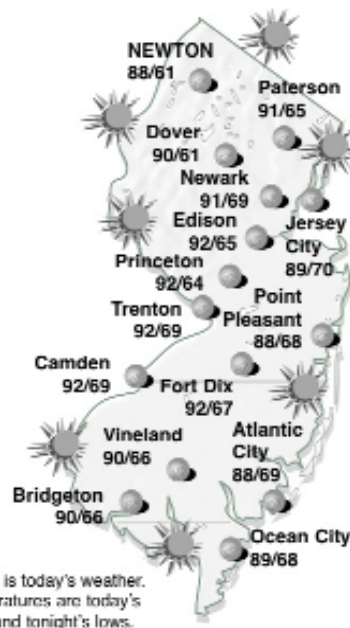

municipal building be used as a forum for both sides to debate.

Deputy Mayor Harry Shortway made a motion for the municipal building to be used for an information session, which Seufert seconded.

After it was decided that

the forum should take place in a larger location than the municipal building, Shortway, Seufert and Councilman Richard Carson voted to approve the action. Rinker voted against. Councilman Michael Pier was absent from the meeting.

Another decision at the meeting caused a divide in the council. There was one open position on the Environmental Commission,

to which Rinker nominated Kevin Whitehead, the owner of Outkast Sports on state Route 94.

Shortway and Seufert said Craig Benda, who ran against Rinker in last November's election, should be considered. Benda had applied for a position on the Land Use Board in March, but was rejected in favor of Paladini.

In response, Rinker read a prepared statement in which

she claimed Benda had posted "slanderous material" about her and Paladini on his website, www.craigbenda.com.

Ultimately, the council voted to appoint Whitehead to the commission, with Shortway casting the only vote for Benda.

New Township Manager Gerald Giamis is planning the upcoming forum on the change in government question. No date has been set.

\$112M to help struggling homeowners

TRENTON (AP) — New Jersey has been awarded \$112 million in federal funding to help struggling homeowners facing foreclosure.

The award was announced by Gov. Chris Christie's administration Thursday.

Starting in 2011, unemployed and underemployed homeowners can apply for help through the New Jersey Home Keeper program.

The program will provide a zero percent interest rate and deferred-payment mortgage loans to homeowners in danger of losing their homes through no fault of their own.

the dam is repaired, "any number of lots may become merged, subdivided or otherwise altered," the handout said.

If the number of properties in the middle tier were at 225, those property owners would be required to pay \$84.70 per year. If the number of properties in the outer tier winds up being 436, then those residents will pay \$24.98 per year, the handout said.

All figures are based on a \$1 million loan to be repaid over a 20-year period with 2 percent interest.

According to another statement released Thursday by township officials, the Township Committee would be open to considering whether all of Wantage should pay for the repair, but there has been no evidence to support such a conclusion.

"The problem is, if it went on the ballot, I seriously doubt it would go through," said Committeeman Bill DeBoer. "Most people in the town don't even know where Lake Neepaulin is, so why would they want to get involved?"

Township Administrator Jim Doherty said the deadline for a question to appear on this November's ballot has already passed.

Additionally, it would be considered a non-binding referendum, meaning the governing body could consider the outcome of the vote, but would not be required by law to accept it.

DeBoer said such a scenario would be less likely to hold up should it be challenged in court by residents who live miles from the lake.

In July, Superior Court Judge B. Theodore Bozonelis ruled that Wantage Township could not back out of its decision to co-sign the loan agreement with FOLN. He ordered both sides to work together to determine how to repay the loan.

"I think we did the right thing. I think we did what we had to do. There really isn't a right decision. Whichever way we would have went, we would have had people that were not happy," DeBoer said. "For the sake of the community and all of Wantage Township, I thought that this was the right thing to do, and now we have to move ahead."
